# Report Cards

We are excited to roll out a new system for student progress on our report cards this year. Though standards-based is not a new concept at all, it is new to us at Mio. It is a more effective and accurate way of reporting to students and families just where the child is in his/her learning of the standard. We are focusing our work on LEARNING rather than working toward points or a letter grade. The work we do is to LEARN and that is what will be communicated through the standards-based system we have adopted. This year you will see a scale from 1-4. It is important to remember that many of the standards are year long, so watching the progress in each area will be of great importance. Focusing on growth and hard work are critical skills!

4 = Above Grade Level

3 = TARGET (at grade level)

2 = Approaching Grade Level

1 = At Risk
